- How being raised with almost all boys shaped my entry into the world.

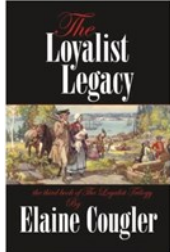
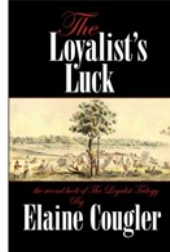
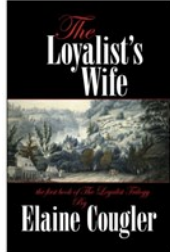
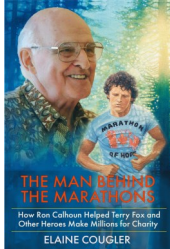
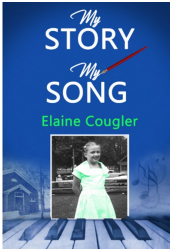
